World Dignity University Initiative Launched – ''An Invitation to Educators from Around the World to Help Advance the Dignity of All People''

On the 24th of June, a world community of scholars, practitioners, and advocates celebrated the launch of an initiative designed to advance "equality in dignity" through education and collaborative action.

Around the world the struggle for equal dignity is growing. Leaders and scholars alike declare that we are in the midst of a "Dignity Revolution"! Yet, education for "equality in dignity" has not kept pace with changing times. In response, a world-class community of scholars, practitioners, and advocates celebrated the launch of a new initiative: The World Dignity University Initiative. Spearheaded by the *Human Dignity and Humiliation Studies* (HumanDHS) network and launched at the *University of Oslo* in Norway on the 24th of June, this initiative is designed to advance dignity through education and global collaboration.

Evelin Lindner, Founding President of HumanDHS, observed, "We are living in times when nothing short of global cooperation can successfully address the urgent problems developing in the world today." Director Linda Hartling, emphasized, "We will need everyone's participation to solve these problems. Dignifying education is the key to participation." Pro-Rector of the University of Oslo, Inga Bostad, invited all to join together in realizing this vision by recognizing that "...education concerning human rights and dignity is a never-ending process of making knowledge meaningful."

In his video contribution, Federico Mayor Zaragoza, former Director-General of UNESCO, supported this global action as a way to build peace for future generations, stating "It is very important that education permanently reflects, at the highest level, at the university level...the equal dignity of all human beings."

The World Dignity University will focus on the innovative use of technology to connect scholars and learners from around the globe. It will encourage ongoing human-to-human interactions, taking a strength-based approach and implementing 360 degree learning and teaching enriched by the wisdom of diverse cultures. In support, Founding Scholar Francisco Gomes de Matos, the esteemed Brazilian Peace Linguist, expressed the significance of this global initiative, stating "Dignity is more than a quality. It is the essence of our humanity."

The World Dignity University will be a beacon of dignity for all working for dignity in the world today.
