In the past, we could afford to overlook the fact that we live on a tiny and finite planet, we could exploit each other and nature without too severe backlashes. This has changed. Nature now warns us with a very loud voice, and when exploited people get angry, they find a globally interconnected arena to hit back. Many among our brothers and sisters have not yet grasped those new facts. YOU have!

In the past, heroes were those who were winning wars. In a globally interconnected world, this kind of heroism is the heroism of fools. In the wars of our time, all lose. In a globally interconnected world, it is a suicidal strategy to identify enemies and try to exterminate them. No longer is competition for domination a path to victory and heroism. It is a path to destruction. In a finite and interconnected world, trying to dominate over enemies, or trying to turn nature into an enemy to be subdued and extracted, is bound to end in utter ruin. Competition for domination over people and nature, over one another and over our habitat, by now represents a strategy of stupendous folly. Admittedly, competition for domination is an

easy strategy, easy to carry out for people who can only think in black and white. Yet, this does not change the fact that in an interconnected world, it is a suicidal strategy.

In an interconnected world, humanity will only survive if we go to your 'enemy' and ask: 'Why are you my enemy?' The answer will be: 'I am not your enemy! I am a peaceful person! I am a victim of your actions! If you humiliate me, I have no choice but to fight to regain my honour! It is you who is my enemy! If you stop being my enemy, I will be only too happy that I can stop defending myself against you!' You will be surprised: wherever you go on this planet, you we will only find victims who are convinced that they do nothing but heroically defending their honour...

Therefore, the new hero is the nuanced thinker like you, the thinker who can hold more than simple black versus white polarizations in her head, the thinker who can hold many shades, the thinker who is able to engage in partnership, cooperation, and dialogue rather than competition for domination. The new hero is the human being who nurtures and invites into mutually enriching dialogue, rather than the warrior who fights enemies.

The old world was one of higher beings presiding over lesser beings and nature. A dignitary was a person of higher standing, a supremacist, who felt entitled to humiliate all those below with the aim to teach them lessons of humility. A dignitary was a person who felt humiliated when asked to stop arrogating superiority. In the new interconnected world in which we live now, we all need to gather in the middle, leaving behind the old world of higher and lesser beings. In the new world we need all beings to hold hands in mutual respect for equality in dignity.

I would therefore like to ask you, on behalf of humanity, to acknowledge that you have a responsibility not just for yourself and your immediate family.
